Policy Distance Learning Action

Computer Use

In order to use school computers, a student must have an Acceptable Use Policy signed. Inappropriate use of technology includes but is not limited to:

- Altering, damaging, deleting or destroying data, the network, system, or software.
- Taking or copying data from a computer system or network.
- Causing disruption of computer services.
- Plagiarizing from electronic sources.
- Use of a system not authorized for students.
- Inappropriate dissemination of receipt of information.
- Use of internet chat rooms.
- Use of computers to access or send sexually explicit or any inappropriate materials.

Policy

Referral to Assistant Principal

Students who are directed to the Assistant Principal's office by a staff member will result in a parent meeting.

Distance Learning Action

| Harassment/Intimidation/Threats Verbal, physical posturing, or sexual harassment, intimidation, threats are prohibited. This includes any hazing, or initiation activities and any cyber bullying. | Removal from virtual class setting. Behavior intervention meeting with relevant parties, including teacher, counselor, family, and support personnel. Site discipline hearing. Restorative circle if appropriate. Revocation of your work permit. |
| Policy | Distance Learning Action |
| Hate Crimes Acts or attempted acts intended to cause physical injury, emotional suffering, or property damage through intimidation, harassment, racial/ethnic slurs and bigoted epithets, vandalism, or threat of force motivated by hostility to the victim's gender, race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or physical or academic abilities. | Removal from virtual class setting. Behavior intervention meeting with relevant parties, including teacher, counselor, family, and support personnel. Site discipline hearing. Restorative circle if appropriate. Revocation of your work permit. |
| Policy | Distance Learning Action |
| Truancy and Tardiness In distance learning, students are expected to attend class regularly and arrive on time. Absences must be called in or send an email within 72 hours. | If a student does not log in to a class or is tardy, they will be directed to the Student Attendance Review Team to develop a reintegration plan to ensure student success. |
| Policy | Distance Learning Action |
| Academic Dishonesty Students must complete and submit their own work. Copying the work of others, submitting someone else's work, plagiarism, or cheating on any assignment or test is unacceptable. Allowing one's work to be copied, plagiarized or submitted is similarly not allowed. | Level 1: Student receives a zero on the classwork; parent contacted. Level 2: Student receives a zero on the classwork, and meets with teacher, parent, and Asst. Principal. Level 3: i.e.: cheating on final exam, theft, or aid in theft of test or teaching material, tampering with grade key, third offense of Level 1 or 2, student receives an "F" for the term, |
