# Santa Cruz High School Distance Learning Policies

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Computer Use

In order to use school computers, a student must have an Acceptable Use Policy signed. Inappropriate use of technology includes but is not limited to:

- Altering, damaging, deleting or destroying data, the network, system, or software.
- Taking or copying data from a computer system or network.
- Causing disruption of computer services.
- Plagiarizing from electronic sources.
- Use of a system not authorized for students.
- Inappropriate dissemination of receipt of information.
- Use of internet chat rooms.
- Use of computers to access or send sexually explicit or any inappropriate materials.

1. Teacher conversation with student(s), corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed.
2. Parent contact by teacher if needed.
3. Muting and removing students from on-line "classrooms" may be used to maintain a safe classroom environment.
4. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Digital Citizenship

Appropriate digital citizenship means that you:

- Use your own name in Zoom or Google Meets
- Don't catfish
- Always use your school Gmail for communication with teachers/peers/staff
- Get permission from others before taking or posting their pictures
- Behave in a breakout room as you would in class
- Follow classroom guidelines regarding the use of sound
- Do not share links of Zoom classes with students outside of the class

Violation of digital citizenship agreements will result in:

1. Teacher conversation with student(s), corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed.
2. Parent contact by teacher if needed.
3. Muting and removing students from on-line "classrooms" may be used to maintain a safe classroom environment.
4. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Distance Learning Action

### Referral to Assistant Principal

Students who are directed to the Assistant Principal's office by a staff member will result in a parent meeting.

Students who do not respond to Assistant Principal's contact attempts are in defiance of school authority and subject to restorative actions and home visit.

## Distance Learning Action

### Respect of Staff

Students are expected to follow all staff members' directions and observe all Google Classroom and Zoom Classroom venue policies.

1. Teacher conversation with students, corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed. Parent contact if needed.
2. Muting and removing students from virtual classroom settings may be used to maintain a safe classroom.
3. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Cell phone use during class time

Disruptive cell phone use during class time will not be tolerated. Students should be focused on learning.

1. Teacher conversation with students, corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed. Parent contact if needed.
2. Muting and removing students from virtual classroom settings may be used to maintain a safe classroom.
3. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Language

Profane and vulgar language is not allowed on campus or in a virtual setting.

1. Teacher conference with students, corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed.
2. Muting and removing students from virtual classroom settings may be used to maintain a safe classroom.
3. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Defiance

Students must comply with school regulations and the authority of any school staff. Willful defiance of the valid authority will not be tolerated.

1. Teacher conference with students, corrective feedback, written reflection, etc. with guidance from administration if needed.
2. Muting and removing students from virtual classroom settings may be used to maintain a safe classroom.
3. Informational referral may be entered into Illuminate.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Harassment/Intimidation/Threats

Verbal, physical posturing, or sexual harassment, intimidation, threats are prohibited. This includes any hazing, or initiation activities and any cyber bullying.

1. Removal from virtual class setting.
2. Behavior intervention meeting with relevant parties, including teacher, counselor, family, and support personnel.
3. Site discipline hearing. Restorative circle if appropriate.
4. Revocation of your work permit.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Hate Crimes

Acts or attempted acts intended to cause physical injury, emotional suffering, or property damage through intimidation, harassment, racial/ethnic slurs and bigoted epithets, vandalism, or threat of force motivated by hostility to the victim's gender, race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or physical or academic abilities.

1. Removal from virtual class setting.
2. Behavior intervention meeting with relevant parties, including teacher, counselor, family, and support personnel.
3. Site discipline hearing. Restorative circle if appropriate.
4. Revocation of your work permit.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Truancy and Tardiness

In distance learning, students are expected to attend class regularly and arrive on time. Absences must be called in or send an email within 72 hours.

If a student does not log in to a class or is tardy, they will be directed to the Student Attendance Review Team to develop a reintegration plan to ensure student success.

## Policy

## Distance Learning Action

### Academic Dishonesty

Students must complete and submit their own work. Copying the work of others, submitting someone else's work, plagiarism, or cheating on any assignment or test is unacceptable. Allowing one's work to be copied, plagiarized or submitted is similarly not allowed.

- Level 1: Student receives a zero on the classwork; parent contacted.
- Level 2: Student receives a zero on the classwork, and meets with teacher, parent, and Asst. Principal.
- Level 3: i.e.: cheating on final exam, theft, or aid in theft of test or teaching material, tampering with grade key, third offense of Level 1 or 2, student receives an "F" for the term, Student and Parent meet with the Assistant Principal.
