

Freshman Year

- Take A-G classes that will prepare you for college and beyond. Being college ready is helpful whether you attend a 2 year college, a 4 year college or a trade school.
- Take required classes in 9th grade
 - Appropriate level of math
 - English 1
 - Biology
 - Ethnic Studies/Health
 - o PE
 - Language other than English / Electives

- Students and Parents: Attend an Academic Planning workshop to learn about Graduation, College requirements and Post Secondary options.
- Stay organized and manage your time by using Infinite Campus to check attendance, grades and assignments.
- Prospective college athletes check NCAA

- Get involved: join clubs, choir, band, play sports and/or volunteer. Keep a record of what you do, it will be helpful when applying to colleges.
- Student will be using <u>californiacolleges.edu</u> for career and college exploration.

Sophomore Year

- Continue taking A-G UC/CSU approved courses
 - Dual Enrollment at Cabrillo College
- Academic 10th-12th GPA's
 - UC minimum GPA is 3.0
 - CSU minimum GPA is 2.5
- Attend college rep visits in the counseling office.
- Visit colleges in person or virtually www.youvisit.com/tours
- Prospective college athletes check NCAA

Junior Year

- Continue taking A-G UC/CSU approved courses
 - Dual Enrollment at Cabrillo College
- Prospective college athletes check NCAA
 - www.web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/
- Take PSAT in *October* (National Merit Scholarship).
- Do well on the CAASPP; English and Math placement for CSU. A score of proficient in the English section is needed to qualify for the Seal of Biliteracy.
- Take AP exams in the spring.
- UC and CSU's are test blind (SAT/ACT no longer required).
- Private College: SAT/ACT's highly recommended .

- Use CCGI to do college research and start a list of colleges you are interested in attending.
- Free scholarship search: www.fastweb.com/
- Attend college rep visits and visit colleges in person or virtual; www.youvisit.com/tours
- Create a resume (list all activities, volunteering, nominations and awards).
- Work on college essays and/ or UC personal insight questions answer 4 out of 8.

Senior Year

- Continue taking A-G UC/CSU approved courses
 - Dual Enrollment at Cabrillo College
- Begin college essays and UC personal insight questions.
- Ask Teachers and Counselors for letters of recommendation if needed.
- Launch your UC/CSU, and FAFSA Application through the CCGI https://www.californiacolleges.edu/#/
- UC and CSU's are test blind (SAT/ACT no longer required).
- Private Colleges: SAT/ACT's highly recommended
- Attend college workshops in *October*.
- When filling out college application note that we are on the semester system (2 grades per class = semester).
- UC/CSU application deadlines window Oct 1-Nov 30th.

- Apply to private colleges. Use Common Application (<u>www.commonapp.org</u>) and complete CSS profile if required.
- Apply for Community College starting *October 1st*.
- Follow Cabrillo College Workshops.
- Apply for private scholarships; check due dates.
- December March 2nd: apply for Federal Financial Aid
 - www.studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa
- Take AP exams in *May*.
- In the Fall, check with your counselor to see if you are a candidate for the Seal of Biliteracy.
- To request a final transcript to be sent to your college, you will need to fill out the transcript request form, which will be available in *May*.
