

General Information

- Join SCHS 12th grade Google Classroom: information, notifications, reminders and college.
- Join the Remind App!
 - Last Names A-L, send a text to 81010; text this message "@25classal".

- Go over your "senior check" with a counselor to determine graduation and A-G eligibility.

- Launch UC/CSU college applications and FAFSA application through the CCGI website

- When filling out college application, note that we are on the semester system (2 grades per class = semester).
- Apply for Financial Aid or Dream Act (*December March 2nd*).
- Free scholarship search <u>www.fastweb.com</u>.
- Check in with the Main Office for SCHS scholarships in early *October*.
- Attend SCHS college application workshops.
 - Oct 21 Oct 25 during 4th period at the library.
- Take AP exams in *May* and be sure to send your scores to the colleges you are applying to.
- Check with a counselor about the Seal of Biliteracy Application.
- National College Decision Day is May 1st.
- *End of May*: Complete Senior exit survey to let us know where we should send your final transcript.

- Ask your counselor for your Transcript to review A-G eligibility.
- Complete 15, A-G courses (11 of them by the end of junior year), with a grade of C or better.
- Students are eligible for admission by earning a 3.0 or greater "A-G" GPA.

- UC's are test blind (SAT/ACT no longer required).

- Any California high school graduate earning a GPA between 2.0 and 2.49 may be evaluated for admissions.
